

Planning and Advanced Reservation of Capacity Agreement (PARCA)

NOTICE: WITHDRAWAL OF PARCA APPLICATION FOR DAMHEAD CREEK 2 POWER STATION

17th May 2017

Dear Industry Colleague,

In accordance with Uniform Network Code (“UNC”) Modification 0465V, National Grid hereby publishes this notice to all interested parties.

On 24th October 2016, National Grid issued a notice with respect to a competent Planning & Advanced Reservation of Capacity Agreement (“PARCA”) application (‘NOTICE: OPENING OF A PARCA EXIT WINDOW, 24th October 2016’).

The PARCA application was for gas National Transmission System (“NTS”) exit capacity of between 16,880,983kWh/d and 28,193,017kWh/d in the London, Suffolk & the South East region of the NTS (Region 9 as per the 2016 Gas Ten Year Statement¹). The indicative capacity Reservation Date specified at the time was 19th April 2017, with the indicative capacity Registration Date of 1st October 2019.

On 21st April 2017 National Grid issued an Informal Notice, in accordance with TPD Section B1.18, (‘Damhead Creek 2 PARCA ExCS Informal Notice (including Exit Substitution & Baseline Revision’). The informal notice confirmed that the PARCA Phase 1 Works had been completed to meet a requirement for 28,193,017kWh/d of exit capacity for Damhead Creek 2 Power Station from 1st October 2020.

Today, 17th May, 2017 National Grid is issuing this notice, in accordance with TPD Section B1.18, to confirm that the PARCA Applicant will not be continuing with the PARCA Application. As such, PARCA Phase 2 will not be progressed, no System Capacity will be reserved and there will be no Registration Date in respect of this PARCA Application.
