


Introduction

- We received 10 responses














TCMF & Consultation Website Areas




Satisfaction with the Gas TCMF






2010 Gas TCMF Priority Work Areas

Comments – How are we doing?

- "The missing question is how well comments are reflected in the final reports - generally much better in this area than other consultations!"
- "The TCMF has always been, and continues to be a useful meeting for discussing charging proposals, price changes and their drivers."
- The TCMF has always been, and continues to be a useful meeting for discussing charging proposals, price changes and their drivers. In addition NGG NTS' voluntary adoption of Mod 186 data has proved most useful."

Comments – What could we do better?

- "The reports generally reflect the diversity of views, ... Would also like to see more detailed rationale from NG NTS where they disagree with particular points made by Shippers."
- "Where Transporter Licence references are made please ensure the exact section is referenced and include a direct link to that section of the Licence (e.g. a footnote), as trying to find it (on Ofgem's website) is often extremely difficult."
- "it is not always clear how open NGG NTS are to suggestions to develop charging methodology proposals. Sometimes NGG NTS will take Shipper suggestions on board, and adopt them fully; however other suggestions are dismissed - there does not appear to be any rationale for these decisions"
- The NG website; "Lots of scrolling is required! It could be more user friendly"



Comments – What should we be doing going forward?

- * "A period of stability is needed to consolidate the constant change we have experienced over the last 5 years. Nearly all the major items have been completed & we should not focus our effort on changes of questionable value."
- * "some changes will be driven forward by other initiatives, such as the governance review or European legislation. ... mindful of the capacity allocation framework guidelines and congestion management principles which are currently progressing. Also work is due to begin on tarification framework guidelines later this year and it would not be sensible to progress changes in the UK which may be at odds with future EU legislation."
